We welcomed our new City Council representative, Dr. Kim Barber, as our speaker at OTNA's March meeting, and heard about her vision for the city. Many of you attended the Mid-Pen Housing presentation on an affordable housing project at Madison and Van Buren Streets. In May, we heard from Officer Leniart about how we can best interact with the Police department, and how to report events and concerns. In August, we had a presentation of a design for a proposed mural by MIIS. At our October meeting, we will hear from P.K. Diffenbaugh, Superintendent of Monterey Peninsula Unified School District, on the shortage of teacher and staff housing and possible solutions.

NCIP UPDATE

The Neighborhood and Community Improvement Program (NCIP) continues year-round to work for the beautification of neighborhoods throughout the city, using funds allocated from the Transient Occupancy Tax the city collects from hotels. For 2023, close to one hundred projects- a mix of old and new-were considered, and the committee narrowed those to 44, totaling \$5,000,000.



Of the 44, two previous Old Town projects were among those that have been forwarded to City Council for approval. The Old Town "winners" are renovations to the Cedar Street path and the addition of a "Welcome to Old Town" sign. The next time you see a need in our neighborhood or the city at large and a solution is evident, consider nominating the project. The form is available on the city website. The dates for submittals, reviews and voting will be determined early in 2024. Our NCIP representatives also met with the city and Monterey Peninsula Unified School District Superintendent Diffenbaugh to discuss the lack of public access to Larkin Park during school hours.

Thanks to the generosity of MPUSD, new fencing has been installed that separates the basketball courts and field used by Bayview Academy from the playground structure and bathrooms, which are now once again open to the public!!



CERT NEWS

Although the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) was not as active in recent months as during the winter storms and flooding, members were called out to participate in missing



and flooding, members were called out to participate in missing person's searches. CERT also helped with traffic control for the annual July 4th parade. Helping search for lost or missing vulnerable children and adults or helping with traffic control gives extra manpower to our police and fire departments and is a valuable service to our community. CERT gives free classes to help train residents to plan for emergencies and assist in helping police and fire, while safely staying out of harm's way. The planned October class is completely full, but a new class will be started early next year.

We are still actively looking for ways to encourage the city to develop a plan for placing our power lines underground.


As we all experienced power outages last fall due to downed power lines on DelMonte, it remains an important issue, as does the need for escape routes to be free from the hazard of downed wires.

Our group continues to research avenues on ways to meet this end.


